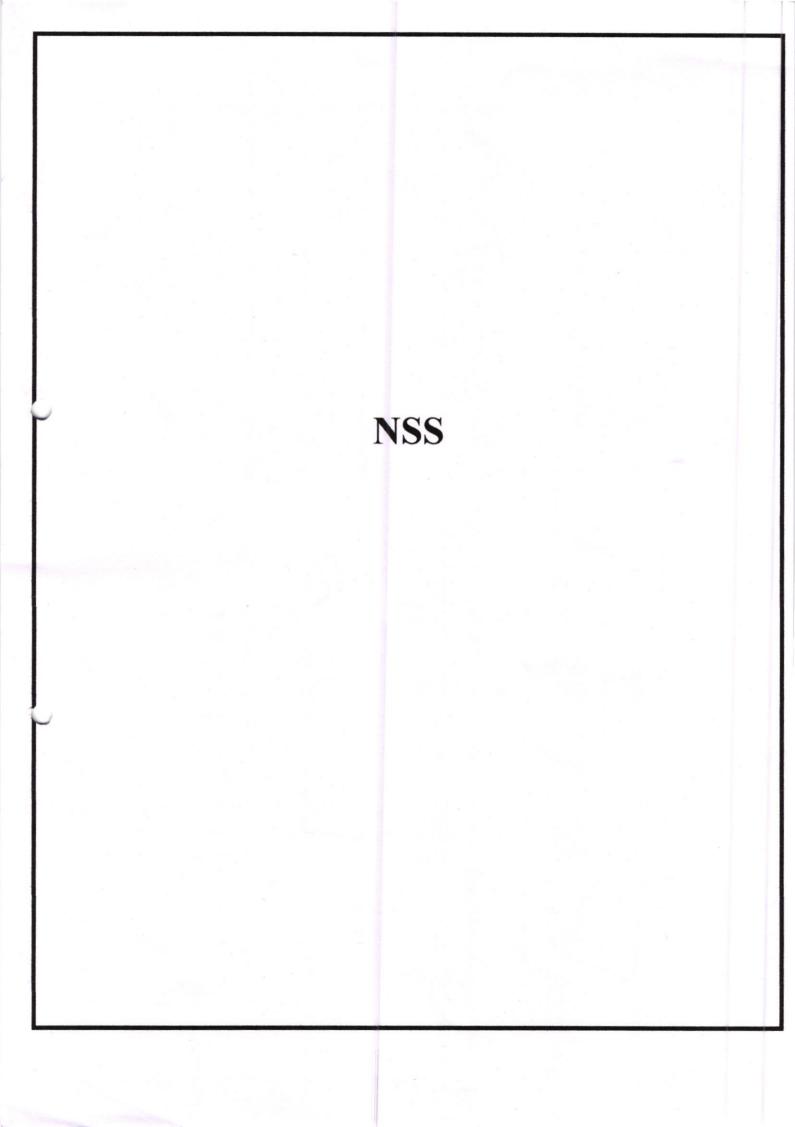

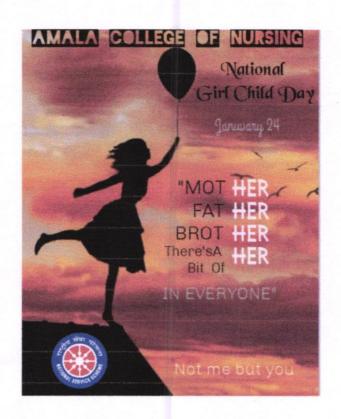
REPORT ON WORLD GIRL CHILD DAY CELEBRATION

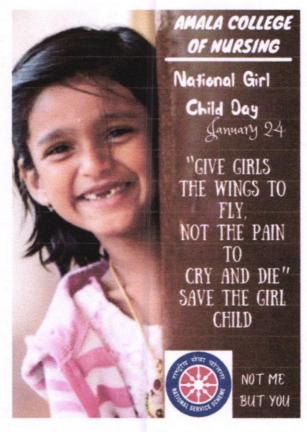

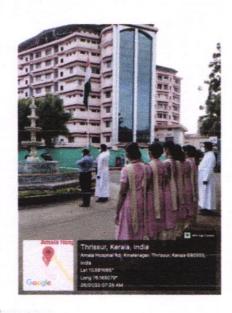


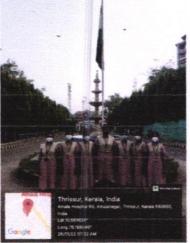
REPORT ON REPUBLICATION

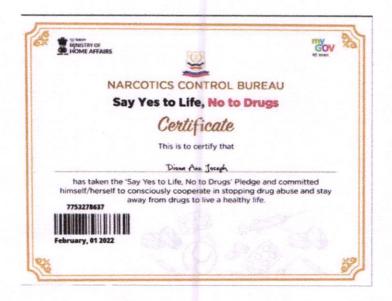


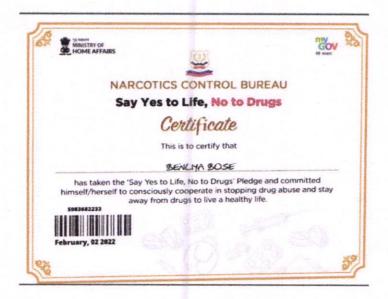


REPORT ON SAY NOT TO DRUGS - PLEDGE

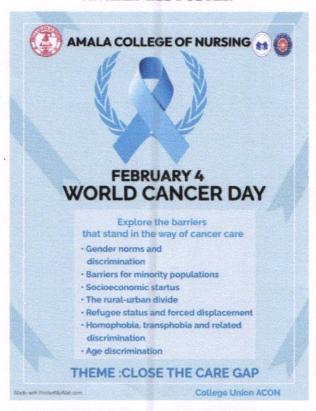

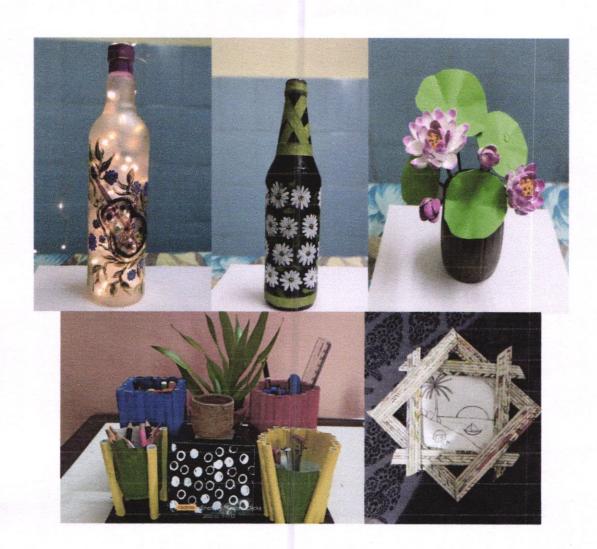




REPORT ON NATIONAL LEVEL NSS COMPETITION

Objectives:

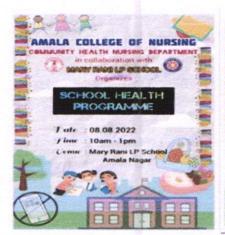
- To raise awareness about the issues affecting the elderly population.

A social advocacy skill training program was organized by the NSS unit in association with IQAC and the department of adult health nursing at Amala College of Nursing on 1/12/2022 from 11 a.m. to 12 p.m.

Objectives:

The training program focused on issues and violence related to dowry and how this could be tackled. The expert speaker was Ms. Saranya C.G.,CDPO, Puzhakkal, Thrissur. The class was organized in lecture hall 2. The class was briefed about protective provisions relating to violence toward married women and about legislative reforms taken up by the central government of India. The session helped the students as the class offered a general awareness of tackling conflicts related to dowry, a social evil.

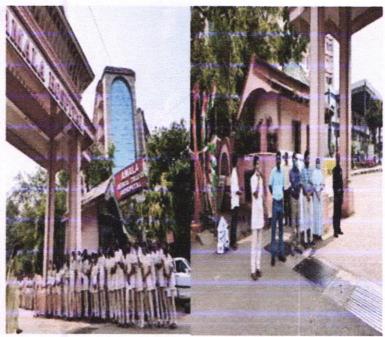

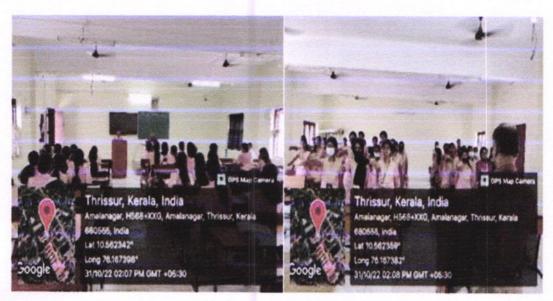
Objective:

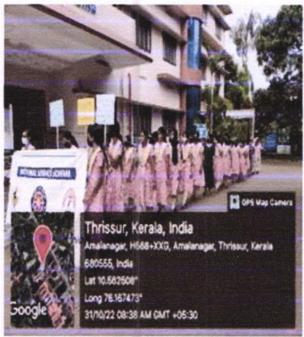

- To enhance the aesthetic appeal of public spaces by transforming blank walls into vibrant expressions of freedom.

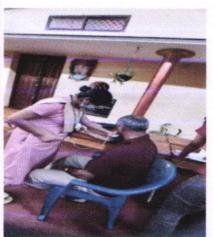

Objectives:

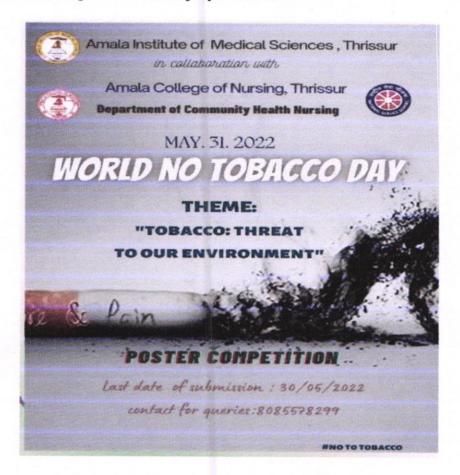

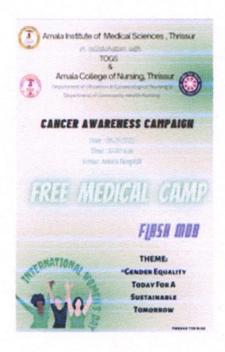




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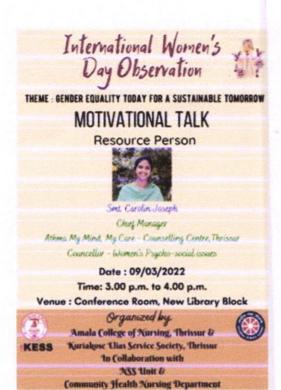
Cancer Awareness Campaign

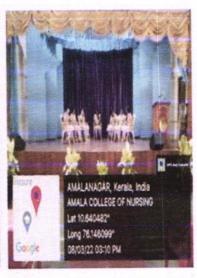

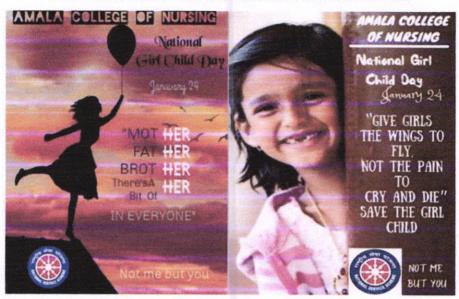

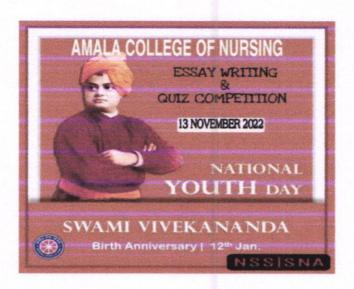
